The City of Rancho Cucamonga has issued a Call for Artists for the Utility Box Beautification Program. The RC Public Art Program is seeking artists to design four (4) utility boxes that will bring a new level of color and creativity to the city. The project will transform blank canvases into functional artwork and highlight the work of local artists to help create a more vibrant, attractive cityscope while contributing to the character of the neighborhood. The chosen art designs will be printed on vinyl and installed on the box.

The four (4) utility box locations are located near:

- Golden Oak Rd. and Fourth St.
- Red Hill Country Club Dr. and Foothill Blvd.
- Carnelian St. and Lemon Ave.
- Etiwanda Ave. and Base Line Rd.

Selected artists will receive a \$750 stipend for the design and completion of the project. Application submission will be from January 7, 2025 - February 2, 2025, or until 100 applications are received.
